Engage with Clinic Transitions

- 1. Ask resident to review their schedule for the last 3 months of the year. When do they stop clinic? Have they chosen their legatee? They should start telling patients at least 3 months prior and scheduling patients with legatee.
- Have they completed information requested by chief resident to send out transition letters? Have they cleaned up their High Risk and Lost to Follow up patient panel for the letters? (See Coaching Topic PGY2 #3 and PGY3 #2) (a)
- 3. Ask them to think about which patient they will chose for the High Risk Handoff. How to make sure patient information does on fall thru the cracks upon their departure. Plan for warm hand off in June to legatee taking high risk patients. (b-c)
